Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. "At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.'

The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go. "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. They're updating their training and recruiting new adult volunteers. And, they're holding informal gatherings for girls, families and volunteers to outline a plan for this year. Currently, we have five troops forming throughout the council. These are girl-only troops that will be working on the same requirements, as there have been no changes to the core curriculum. The Scouts BSA program will include the same aims and methods as it always has. Now these young ladies will be able to participate in fun and challenging activities that promote character development and physical fitness while encouraging them to be leaders in their homes, schools and communities.
