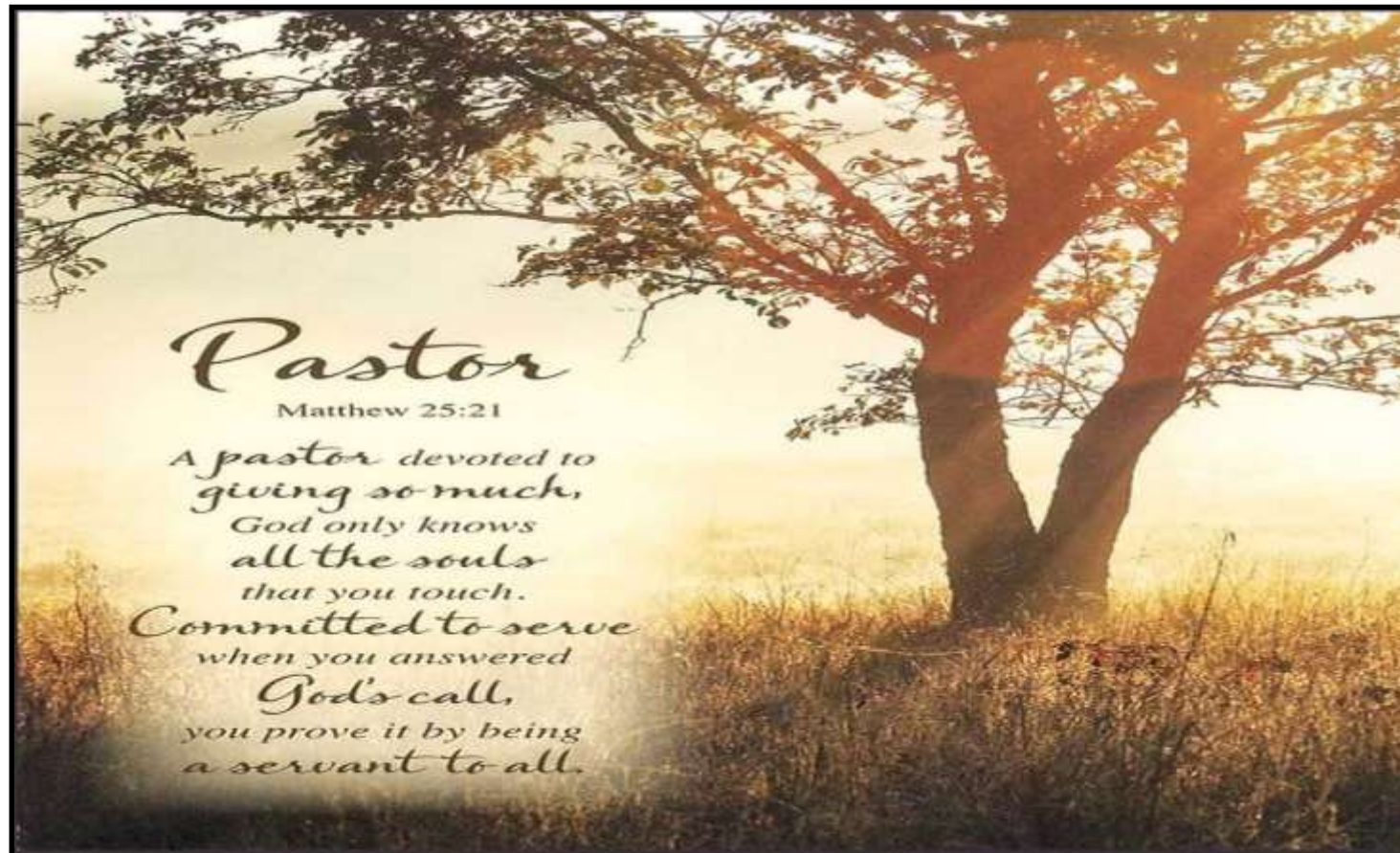

Life is a journey... a contest that challenges us. A race to be run. I love the way this advice can be found in Eugene Peterson's translation from *The Message*. He translates Hebrews 12:2-3 in this way.

No extra spiritual fat, no parasitic sins. Keep your eyes on *Jesus*, who both began and finished this race we are in. Study how he did it. And now he's *there*, in the place of honor, right alongside God. When you find yourselves flagging in your faith, go over that story again, item by item, that long litany of hostility he plowed through. *That* will shoot adrenaline into your souls!"

Jesus was headed down a path of suffering, yet He endured and sweated blood... it was not easy to die. Yet, Jesus wanted with all his heart to do the Father's will... to be the salvation of the entire creation. The theme of living the will of God and to know how much each of us is loved, even in the midst of our own sufferings, will make all the difference in our journey ahead. So, RUN YOUR RACE... know you are not alone. God bless!

Red Bank UMC after-school program

Red Bank UMC offers an After-school program for children grades PM 4k-5th grade. We offer snacks, play time, fun activities, homework time and devotion. We pick up from Carolina Springs Elementary, Saxe Gotha Elementary, Deerfield Elementary, and Red Bank Elementary. We are able to keep children till 6pm during the school year. The cost is \$2,340 for the year and is broken down into weekly payments of \$60. Space is limited, enroll soon!

Red Bank UMC After School also offers AM 4k pick up from Saxe Gotha Elementary and Carolina Springs Elementary. The cost is \$60/week till 2pm or \$120/week till 6pm. Children would need to bring their lunch, snacks are provided. Children would have devotions, schoolwork time, play time and fun activities.

Red Bank UMC After school is now offering E-Learning days as well for parents who need somewhere for their children to go on virtual days. The cost is \$25 per day unless they are already enrolled in After School then the price is \$12 per day for children grades 4k-5th grade. Drop off starts at 7:15 am and runs till 6pm if needed. Two snacks will be provided, and you would need to send lunch with your child. We will have dedicated times for virtual learning as well as devotion, play time, and fun activities.

Scout Ministry News—October 2020

The Scout Law: A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent.

To turn on the news or social media today is to see images and watch clips of “protests” that are happening around our country. A Scout **is brave** and willing to stand for justice. Are these protests a way to justice? While there is such a thing as a peaceful protest, the majority of the ones I have witnessed have been rioting and looting and have always been accompanied by shouting and angry words. [Words are powerful. In fact, all of creation began with a single word: אור which](#) translated into English means, “Let there be light.” (Gen 1:3) John 1:1 tells us that “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God.” Verse 14 identifies the Word as Jesus, the image of the invisible God in Whom all things were created (Col 1:15 & 16). But what about our words? Do they make any difference? The Bible has quite a bit to say about this subject. Psalm 19:14 says, “Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord.” “Too much talk leads to sin. Be sensible and keep your mouth shut,” is great advice from Proverbs 10:19. Proverbs 15:1 reminds us that “a gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.” Jesus warned the Pharisees (and us!) that “it’s not what goes into your mouth that defiles you; you are defiled by the words that come out of your mouth.” (Matt 15:11) One of my favorite verses on the subject of our words comes from the Apostle Paul in his letter to the Ephesians: “Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what **is helpful** for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.” (Eph 4:19)

I don’t often watch music videos but was shown one the other day that I would recommend to all. Toby Mac sings a song entitled, “Speak Life.” A portion of the lyrics say, “Though it’s crazy, amazing, we can turn a heart through the words we say. Mountains crumble with every syllable. Hope can live or die.” The images depict a boy being teased by others, a woman being yelled at by her husband, an elderly gentleman given the facts of his diagnosis with no compassion. In each scene, the individual “dies” because of the words spoken. But then the lyrics encourage us to “Look into the eyes of the broken-hearted; watch them come alive as soon as you speak hope, you speak love, you speak life.” We see a golden-haired child get down beside each “dead” person and begin to whisper to them. As she speaks hope, love and life, each one begins to move again, wake up and smile. This is all a dramatization, of course, but one that we should take to heart. Yes, we live in a broken and cursed world where life is rarely ever fair. We must stand up for those who are unable and seek justice where we can. But remember: “The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.” (Prov 12:18) Always speak life. Robin George, Troop 518 Chaplain

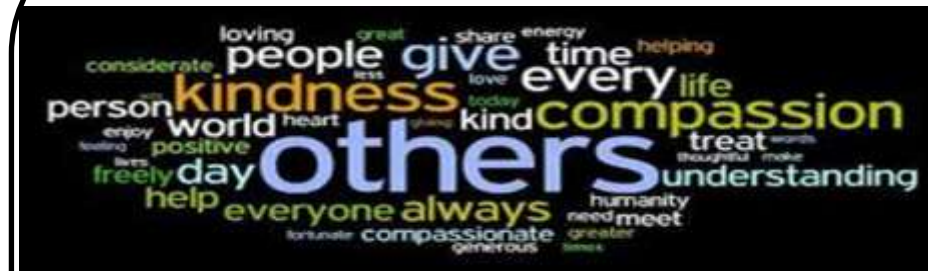
