

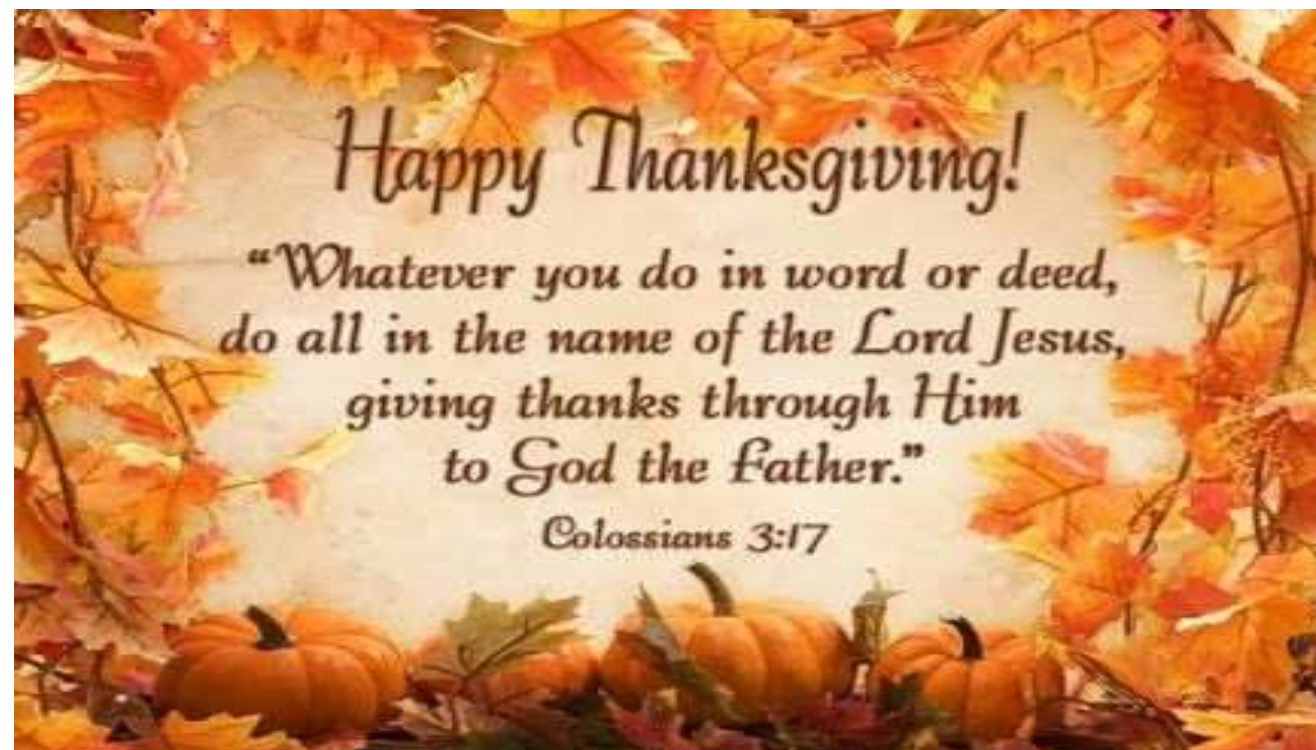

Your sin has been dealt with. The Triune God has removed the stain of sin from you "as far as the east is from the west" (Psalm 103:12). Your sins have been washed away (1 Corinthians 6:11). When God looks at you, your sin has been removed by the blood of Christ. He has not one condemning thought toward you (Romans 8:1). But that's not the end of the story... you have been given a new heart. The promise of the new covenant is this: "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws" (Ezek. 36:26 -27). This new heart is one that wants to please God... not to get God to love you, but because God loves you and you love God. This is the reason that it's called Good News. A new heart wants to serve. A new heart wants to give. A new heart wants to help others see God as a loving, caring, generous God who wants to "lavish" His love upon each person (Ephesians 1). A new heart wants to share this through evangelism both personal (testimony) to friends and (corporate) at church with other believers in worship and study. A new heart is transforming to your life here on earth and it beats with the rhythm of eternity.

Sadly, many Christians today are living back in the old covenant. They've had Jeremiah 17:9 drilled into them, and they walk around believing my heart is deceitfully wicked. Not anymore, it's not. There is more to the story in Jeremiah. Jeremiah 31:33, God tells the rest of the story: "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people." Paul says in Romans 2:29, "No, a man is a Jew if he is one inwardly; and circumcision is circumcision of the heart, by the Spirit." Sin is not the deepest thing about you. You have a new heart. Did you hear me? Your heart is *good*. Through your faith in Jesus (as your Savior) when God sees you, God sees the forgiven, humble human being that was known from the beginning of time.
